Towpaths to Our Culture

Cruise the Canal

Now here's a boat with some real horsepower — or rather, mule power. The Volunteer is a replica 1840s canal boat carrying visitors on 60- and 90-minute trips up and down the historic Illinois & Michigan Canal. Forget steam or coal — the Volunteer is powered by Moe the Mule, who pulls the ship from the shore just the same as the 19th-century vessels that traversed this canal. Browse keepsakes from the gift shop, then fuel up for your journey at the Lock 16 Café, featuring a menu of delicious, handcrafted dishes.

A Landmark Estate

Designed by W.W. Boyington — the architect who designed the famous Chicago Water Tower — the **Hegeler Carus Mansion** is a stunning architectural marvel built in the Second Empire style. Completed in 1876 with seven levels, an eye-popping 57 rooms, and about 16,000 square feet of floor space, this National Historic Landmark features detailed parquet floors, hand-painted ceilings, and 10 hand-carved marble fireplaces.

Outdoor Fun

Rotary Park, sprawling over 110 picturesque acres, is your ultimate destination for fun, relaxation, and adventure. Conveniently located just off I-39, the park provides a tranquil spot for a leisurely stroll, a vibrant place for family fun, or a venue for community events — Rotary Park has it all.

Out in the Open

Outdoor experiences around La Salle are truly singular to the Illinois River Valley — destinations that define the history and culture of the entire region. Spanning 61.5 miles from Rockdale and ending in La Salle, the I&M Canal State Trail provides a partly paved surface winding through varied landscapes and landmarks, including state parks and historical sites. Accessible at Lock 14, the flat trail provides an easy, level surface for both hikers and bikers — in fact, guests wishing to pedal the trail may rent bikes at 754 First St.

Brimming with evidence of North
American glaciation thousands of years
ago, *Mitchell's Grove Nature Preserve* is a
testament to the fascinating geological
phenomena that shaped the Midwest.
Donated to the state by William H. and
Irene Mitchell in 1998, the 184-acre
wooded park — classified as a glacial
refugium — features cliffs, bluffs, and
foliage more characteristic of northern
latitudes like Minnesota and Canada.

Up for a quick round? The 18-hole course at *Senica's Oak Ridge Golf Club* provides a championship-caliber challenge for golfers of all skill levels. This 6,900-yard, par-72 course features gorgeous, oak-lined fairways, sparkling lakes and water hazards, and nearly 50 sand traps. Stock up at the club's on-site pro shop — and for the 19th hole, grab a bite or a refreshing beverage at their restaurant.

Treat Yourself in La Salle

Set in a revitalized and historic downtown, locally owned shopping and dining options in La Salle offer an uncommon experience for all tastes. Here, the charming storefronts that formed the backbone of commerce in La Salle carry on that legacy with shops, boutiques, diners, and restaurants providing an exceptional experience for both residents and those just passing through.
